The B52 bomber crash in Stone Lake in 1965 brought a group of brothers to our museum to visit the special display on the crash. Five of the seven men were brothers of one of the crew members who perished in this crash and two were nephews. They had been searching the internet for information on the crash when they came upon our museum site and the They decided then to crash information. make a pilgrimage to Stone Lake and, while at the museum, met with Forester Ross Langham who escorted the group to the crash site. They had a very emotional visit and they couldn't thank us enough for keeping their brother's memory alive. They said our museum carried much more information than their family had ever been given at the time of the tragedy. Did you know that we are still receiving pieces of debris from that crash 49 years ago?

#### CHRISTMAS STOCKING STUFFERS




