FIRST TOWN HALL RESTORATION PROJECT

The First Town Hall Restoration Project donations are coming in regularly and we thank everyone who has contributed to date. As you know, we have categories in which we will honor donors and their loved ones, and would like to list the donations received as of March 31, the date of this newsletter's publication:

A total of \$5,800 has been received through March, 2010, and we are very gratified at the early response. The total amount that will be needed to complete the project is \$18,500 so as you can see, \$12,700 is still needed. The building has been moved, and when the weather improves, work will resume with the block work for the foundation. Once the building is lowered onto its permanent foundation, the interior work can begin, and the construction of Preservation Hall, which will connect the current museum and the town hall, will begin. On the last page of this newsletter you will find a form which may be used to send your donation, and honor someone special in the process.

THE TRAVELING TRUNK

As part of our educational mission, the Stone Lake Area Historical Society began its Traveling Trunk Program last spring. Connie Schield created the program which was presented to the 4th and 5th grade classes at the Stone Lake Elementary School. In April, 2009, Charity Brabec, the teacher of these grades, graciously allowed Connie to come into her classroom and talk to the students about the history of Stone Lake.

The students had just completed a study of the history of Wisconsin and were well prepared to answer the questions which were asked of them during the presentation. After a short introduction, each student was given a file card which contained biographical information about one of the founding families from Stone Lake. Each student got a chance to assume the role of this family as they read it to the class. If possible Connie would show the class a picture of the family or individual after the biography had been Then, Connie opened the Traveling Trunk and took out an antique (from the her collection) and or from museum explained what it was and how this family might have used it as pioneers in Stone Lake. The students were very interested in both the biographies and the antiques. Many of the students commented on how their family is related to one of the pioneers.

The 90 minute presentation ended with each student being given a Stone Lake Area Historical Society tee-shirt and an invitation

for the class to visit the museum. Ms. Brabec and her class walked to the museum in early May, 2009, and did a tour of the museum. All of the students were excited about the opportunity and very interested in the exhibits. Connie and the Traveling Trunk will visit the Stone Lake Elementary School again this April and the class will once again tour the museum and the depot.
