







GIFT OF RAILROAD CROSSING SIGN

Peggy Marxen presents her book The Farm on Badger Creek on Thursday, July 27th at the Stone Lake Town Hall at 7:00.


She grew up on a dairy farm in the small town of Meteor in Northwestern Sawyer County. In her book, she witnesses the vanishing of a family dairy farm



way of life and the changes to rural Wisconsin. She shares her stories of a close-knit extended family that sustained a farm through hard weather and even harder times through the revolutions in agricultural technology and transportation. Marxen shares stories of her family's subsistence dairy herd and the hunting, fishing, the selling of timber and maple syrup which sustained the family. She re-counts the three mile walk to her one-room school and recalls the lack of electricity, indoor plumbing and

telephone. The author uses both humor and nostalgia throughout her book.

Please join us at the Stone Lake Town Hall (across from the fire hall and museum). Refreshments will be served. This is a joint presentation with the Sawyer County Historical Society.
